Introducing our Judges

Regular exhibitors will be well acquainted with our judges this year. Open shows are in danger of becoming 'a rare breed' so if you believe they are useful in bringing on your youngsters and enjoyable for their social aspect PLEASE give them your support.

MRS ROBERTA CURRAN 'XANDERO': Along with her husband, Roberta has owned and successfully shown Great Danes for about 30 years and have had a number of Group and BIS winning dogs. Along the way they have owned an Irish Wolfhound and Roberta successfully showed many of this breed from the Nutstown kennel .She has also been involved with obedience training and successfully undertook the Bronze, Silver and Gold awards with their Border Collie. Roberta awards GS's to all breeds in Group 2 and the Group and has undertaken many judging appointments over the years , the most recent notable appointment was to judge the Great Dane Club of Queensland Ch Show Australia in July 2016.

MR GERARD THOMPSON 'GERAGOLD': Originally from Co. Donegal Gerard moved to the USA in 1992. Whilst living in Ireland he successfully showed Irish Soft Coated Wheaten Terriers in Ireland and the UK. After moving with his partner to America they continued to breed and show this breed as well as Great Danes and Briards. They have also shown a couple of Kerry Blue Terriers to their Championships. Geragold Wheatens have been sent back to Europe, notably Finland and one has been most successfully shown in Ireland namely Irish, American, Canadian Ch Geragold Orla Finhlandia An Ch the first in the breed to hold these titles. Awards GS'S to a number of breeds in the Terrier Group and has judged at non championship level in USA.

MR MYLES LEONARD 'PLENARD': Comes from a pedigree steeped in Irish Dogdom as both parents as well as a grandmother are well known in our hobby. Aquired his first dog about 20 years ago and has had Scottish Terriers for about 10 years. Has grown up with among others Kerry Blue Terriers, Bichon Frise, Shih Tzu, Cavaliers, Tibetan Spaniels and Poodles. Awards GS's in a number of terrier breeds, has judged all groups and BIS at Open Show level in Ireland and Utility Breeds and Group in the UK

MRS FRAN DEVENNEY 'FRANROVIC': Fran has been involved with dog showing for over 20 years starting with Cavalier King Charles Spaniels along with her father. Since then they have collected CC'c and Reserve CC's in the UK and made up Irish and International Champions both at home and abroad in Japanese Spitz, Keeshonds and American Cocker Spaniels the most recent champion being the first Irish owned chocolate Am Cocker Spaniel to hold both the Irish and International Ch titles. Awards GS's in a number of Gundog breeds and has extensive judging experience at Open Show level.

MS CHERYL DONALDSON 'CHERDON' : Cheryl got introduced to dog showing by handling Flat Coated Retrievers over 12 years ago. Her first showdog was a German Shorthaired Pointer Irish Ch Crainfield With Cherdon, a breed she has had for over 10 years making many Irish Champions. More recently became involved with a Basset Fauvre De Bretagne making him GB, Irish, Luxembourg & Int Ch & Sh Cert of Merit. More recently still has made up her Am Cocker Spaniel tp Iriah Ch. By profession is a dog groomer specialising in gundog and hound breeds

The Companion Show with the proceeds going to local Grovehill Animal Shelter will take place as usual.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. The show will open at **9.30 am**
2. Dogs will be received at any time but it is the exhibitors responsibility to ensure that exhibits are available for judging when required.
3. Judging will commence at **10.30 am Sharp**
4. Exhibits may be removed from the Show after their judging has been completed. The Show will close half an hour after all judging has been completed.
5. **ENTRY FEES:**

First entry including Catalogue	£8.00
Subsequent entries, except stakes	£2.00
Stakes Classes	£3.00
Exhibit entered only in Stakes Class	£8.00
Junior Handling	£1.00
6. **STAKES PRIZE MONEY:** Percentage of entry money: 1st 30% , 2nd 15%, 3rd 10%, 4th 5%.
7. The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
8. Puppies under six calendar months of age on the first day of the Show are not eligible for exhibition.
9. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the Show is forbidden.

Please Note

From 1st January 2015, and for a period of two years the Kennel Club Show Regulations which stipulate that dogs must be entered and exhibited in a breed class before exhibiting in an Any Variety Class/Stakes Class and that only unbeaten dogs are eligible to compete in the group or best in competitions are suspended (Please refer to the FAQ's on the Kennel Club website for further information)

10. **Best Puppy in Show (if scheduled).**

Where a Best Puppy in Show competition is scheduled the Best Puppy in Show is a puppy which has competed and has been declared Best Puppy in Breed, Best Any Variety Not Separately Classified Puppy or Best Any Variety Imported Breed Register Puppy. A puppy is a dog of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show. Where the Best of Breed, Best in Group or Best in Show is a puppy it should automatically be awarded Best Puppy in Breed, Best Puppy in Group and Best Puppy in Show respectively. Where the Reserve Best of Breed, Reserve Best of Group or Reserve Best in Show is a puppy which has only been beaten by an adult dog it should also automatically be awarded Best Puppy in Breed, Best Puppy in Group and Best Puppy in Show respectively. Consequently, selection of Best Puppy in Breed, Best Puppy in Group and Best Puppy in Show must follow the selection of Best of Breed, Best in Group and Best in Show respectively.

Best Puppy in Group and subsequent Group placings must be selected from:

- a) Those puppies declared Best Puppy in Breed.
- b) The puppy declared Best Puppy from the Any Variety Not Separately Classified classes in each group or on each day.
- c) Best Puppy in Show must be selected from the Best Puppy in Group winners.

11. **Best in Show**

The dog declared Best in Show is a dog which has competed and has been declared Best of Breed, Best Any Variety Not Separately Classified or Best Any Variety Imported Breed Register

- a. Shows Judged on the Group System (Definition; Shows judged on the Group System includes classes for breeds within more than one group, as defined in Kennel Club Regulation B(A); and require a judge to declare a best of each group after which the exhibits so declared will compete for the award of Best in Show and Reserve Best in Show.)
1. **Best of Breed**
Where a breed is separately classified a Best of Breed may be declared but only from those dogs which have received a first prize in a breed class at the show. Where separate classes are provided for each sex of a breed a Best of each Sex must be declared.
2. **Best of Group**
Best of group and subsequent placings must be selected from:-
- a) The Best of Breed winners in each group.
- b) The Best Dog from the Any Variety Not Separately Classified classes in each group or on each day.
- c) The Best dog from Any Variety Imported Breed Register classes in each Group or on each day.
3. **Best in Show**
Best in Show must be selected from the Best of Group winners. Reserve Best in Show must be selected from the remaining Group winners following the selection for Best in Show.
12. Exhibits will not be admitted to Best in Show competition after a period of ten minutes has elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging, unless they have been unavoidably delayed by previous judging not being completed on time, and then only with the special permission of the Show Management.
13. **Exhibitors must not pick up dogs by their tails and leads when lifting them nor handle a dog in a manner which causes its feet not touch the ground when on the move.** This is not acceptable. Exhibitors should note that such practice would constitute harsh handling and reports of such practice will be referred to the Committee under Kennel Club Show Regulation F11.
14. All exhibitors must be familiar with Kennel Club Regulation F (Annex B) Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.
15. All dogs resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.
16. **DOGS IN CARS ON HOT DAYS**
Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the Board for disciplinary action under the Kennel Club Rules and Regulations.
Show Schedule Notice to be reproduced (See Annex A to Schedule).
17. **Not for Competition: Either a or b:**
- a. Not for Competition entries will be accepted. Details of each dog so entered must be recorded on the entry form and must be Kennel Club registered or
- b. Not for Competition entries not accepted
18. No modifications will be made to this schedule except by permission of the Board of the Kennel Club, which will be followed by advertisement in the Canine Press wherever possible.

Use of Electrical Equipment at Shows

The Kennel Club is becoming increasingly concerned at the amount of electrical equipment being used by exhibitors at shows, including hair dryers and hair straighteners and other grooming devices. Electrical equipment should not be brought to shows unless absolutely necessary. In rare instances where

it might be required, it should be PAT tested and permission sought from the secretary of the show before it is used.

The Kennel Club has also been informed of recent instances of exhibitors commandeering certain areas of a venue in order to have access to power points so as to use electrical grooming equipment. This is totally unacceptable and particularly unfair on the breeds whose allocated areas have been cramped because of this selfish behaviour.

Security at shows

In light of recent events the Kennel Club would like to issue a reminder to all Societies of the importance of security at dog shows.

The Kennel Club understands that due to the nature of dog shows and the quantity of paraphernalia exhibitors bring it would be extremely difficult for show organisers to take on the issue of security alone, therefore we would reiterate the advice being given by the Police and security services, that everyone in the UK should remain vigilant and this applies to those organising and taking part in dog shows.

The importance of exhibitors feeling that they and their dogs are safe when attending a show cannot be underestimated. We would therefore remind you of the importance of the need for show organisers and exhibitors to remain mindful of potential dangers and that all visitors generally need to be vigilant and alert. Furthermore the society should provide robust notification informing exhibitors of where to report to should they see anything suspicious or of concern, and of the evacuation procedures in place.

DOGS IN CARS ON HOT DAYS

- Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts travelling to and whilst at KC licensed events.
- When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.
- If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all.
- The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink.
- Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog.
- When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.
- Keep the dog in the shade – take your own shade for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.
- Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time.

Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare.

Ring 1: Veteran Stakes, Puppy Bitch Stakes, Toy Breeds as schedule, Toy Group, Utility Breeds as per schedule, Utility Group

Ring 2: Puppy Dog Stakes, Hound Breeds as schedule, Hound Group, Terrier Breeds, Terrier Group.

Ring 3: Minor Puppy Bitch Stakes, Golden Retriever, Working Breeds as schedule, Working Group. Pastoral Breeds as schedule, Pastoral Group,

Ring 4: Minor Puppy Dog Stakes, Gundog Breeds as schedule, Cocker Spaniels, Gundog Group.

JUNIOR HANDLING WILL BE JUDGED

IN THE FIRST AVAILABLE RING AFTER 12 NOON

**To facilitate the smooth running of the show,
the management may move a breed/breeds
to another ring (Not Before 12noon)**

DEFINITIONS OF CLASSES

In the following definitions, a Challenge Certificate includes any Show award that counts towards the title of Champion under the Rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club.

Wins at Championship Shows in breed classes where Challenge Certificates are not on offer shall be counted as wins at Open Shows.

In the case of a dog owned in partnership and entered in Members' classes or competing for Members' Specials each partner must at the time of entry be a member of the Society.

In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including the seventh day before the date of closing of postal entries shall be counted when entering for any class i.e. **(31st March 2018)**.

Wins in Variety classes do not count for entry in Breed classes but when entering in Variety classes, wins in both Breed and Variety classes must be counted. A first prize does not include a Special Prize of whatever value.

A dog is not eligible for entry in Variety Classes unless also entered and subsequently exhibited in a Breed class where such a class is provided for which it is eligible. Exemptions from this Regulation are:-

- (1) A puppy, unless a class for dogs under twelve months of age for which it is eligible is provided for the breed.
- (2) A dog in Any Variety Field Trial or Working Trial Class.
- (3) A dog in Any Variety Veteran Class.
- (4) A dog in Any Variety Champion Class.
- (5) As provided in Kennel Club Definitions of Classes.
- (6) A dog which is withdrawn from exhibition in breed classes as a result of the appointment of an emergency judge.
- (7) A dog in Good Citizen Scheme Classes.
- (8) Exhibits bred by the scheduled breed Judge.

(1) If an exhibitor reports before the judging of a class or classes that a dog has been entered which is ineligible, the exhibitor may choose one of the following options:-

1. **WITHDRAWAL:** The dog may be withdrawn from competition subject to the conditions of Regulations 9(j) and 20.
2. **TRANSFER:**
 - a. If a dog is ineligible for a class or classes as regards its breed, colour, sex, weight or height the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the equivalent class or classes for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height or, in the event of there being no equivalent class, Minor Puppy and Puppy excepted, to the Open class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height.
 - b. For an exhibit entered incorrectly in a Minor Puppy class, Puppy class or Junior Class, which is over age but under twelve calendar months of age, eighteen calendar months of age or twenty-four calendar months of age respectively, the Show Secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the Puppy Class, Junior Class or Yearling Class respectively for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height and in the event of there being no Puppy, Junior or Yearling Class to the Open class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height.

- c. For any reason other than the above, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the Open class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height.
- d. If an exhibit arrives late and misses a class, even if it is the only class in which the dog is entered, the dog may not be transferred to any other class.

PUPPY For dogs of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

JUNIOR For dogs of six and not exceeding eighteen calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

GRADUATE For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or four or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Graduate, Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes, whether restricted or not where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed

LIMIT For dogs which have not become show Champions under the Kennel Club Regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club **or won 3 or more CACIB/CAC/Green Stars** or won 7 or more First Prizes in all at Championship Shows in Limit or Open Classes confined to the Breed, whether restricted or not at Shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed. **OPEN** For all dogs of the breeds for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the Show.

VETERAN For dogs of not less than seven years of age on the first day of the Show.

REGULATIONS FOR THE PREPARATION OF DOGS FOR EXHIBITION F **(ANNEX B)**

1. These regulations must be observed when a dog is prepared for exhibition and/or exhibited at any Kennel Club Licensed events. Objections may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under these Show Regulations and/or for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rule A42.
 - (a) A dog found to have been exhibited in breach of these Regulations will automatically be disqualified from Exhibition at the Show and from any award gained thereat.
 - (b) Unless the exhibitor provides a satisfactory explanation for the dog being exhibited in breach of these Regulations then he/she may be subject to further penalties of either a fine or as listed under Rule 42.
2. (a) No substance which alters the natural colour, texture or body of the coat may be present in the dog's coat for any purpose at any time during the Show. No substance which alters the natural colour of any external part of the dog may be present on the dog for any purpose at any time during the Show.
 - (b) Any other substance (other than water) which may be used in the preparation of a dog for exhibition must not be allowed to remain in the coat or on any other part of the dog at the time of exhibition.
3. No act or operation which alters the natural confirmation of a dog or any part thereof may be performed except:
 - (a) Operations certified to the satisfaction of the General Committee.
 - (b) The removal of dew-claws of any breed.
 - (c) Operations to prevent breeding provided that such operations are notified to the Kennel Club before neutered dogs are shown.Nor must anything be done calculated to in the opinion of the General Committee to deceive.
4. The General Committee without previous notice may order an examination of any dog or dogs at any Show. Any examination thus ordered will be made by a person having executive authority who shall have a written directive from the Kennel Club in their possession. Samples may be taken for further examination and analysis.
5. An individual has the right to lodge an objection to a dog only if he/she is the owner or handler of a dog competing in the same breed or lass. An objection may however be lodged by an official of the Show or by anyone so deputed by the Kennel Club. It will be the responsibility of the individual who lodges the objection or the official (as appropriate) to substantiate the grounds for the objection. The Kennel Club will substantiate the grounds for an objection made on its behalf.
6. Any objection by an individual related to an infringement of these regulations must be made in writing to the Show Secretary at his/her office before close of the Show and the individual must produce evidence of identity at the time of lodging the complaint.
