Bitches: Baby Puppy, Puppy, Junior, Intermediate, Open, Champion, Veteran, and

Neuter

#### DEFINITION OF CLASSES AT BREED CHAMPIONSHIP SHOW

### (All age classes computed from date of birth.)

A Puppy Class is confined to dogs over 6 and under 12 calendar months of age on the first day of the Show computed from and inclusive of the date of its birth.

A Junior Class is for dogs between 9 and 18 calendar months of age on the first day of the Show, computed from and inclusive of the date of its birth.

An Intermediate Class is for dogs between 15 and 24 calendar months of age on the first day of the Show, computed from and inclusive of the date of its birth.

An Open Class is for dogs over 15 months of age on the first day of the Show, computed from and inclusive of the date of its birth.

A Champions Class is for dogs who have gained the Title of Champion under Irish Kennel Club Rules or under a recognised Kennel Authority confirmed by the date of closing of entries.

A Veteran Class is for dogs over eight years of age on the first day of the Show, computed from and inclusive of the date of its birth.. Please Note: A Veteran Dog who is a Champion may enter in either Veteran or Champion Class but not both.

A Neutered Class: A Neutered male and Neutered Female are confined to this class and can compete for Best Neuter in Breed and go forward for Best Neuter in Show (they may not compete for the Green Star).

N.B.: A Dog or Bitch may be entered in ONE BREED CLASS ONLY (No double entries) Dogs entered in restricted classes must also be entered in one of the Standard Classes for the breed. All dogs entered must be registered or transferred at the Irish Kennel Club in the name of the Exhibitor.

#### GREEN STAR CHALLENGE

At National All Breed Ch. Shows, Group Ch. Shows and Breed Club Ch. Shows. All CLASS WINNERS graded EXCELLENT or Puppies VERY PROMISING may challenge for the Green Star.

Best Puppy, Best Junior, Best Veteran, Best Neuter will be judged after Best of Breed.

# Special Classes will be judged after the above:

- 1. Special Beginners Stakes: To be eligible to compete neither the owner/handler or dog will have won a green star prior to the entry closing date of the show. This is judged on the quality of the dog and placings are 1 to 3 as in the other stakes classes. In the event that a dog is co-owned, all owners must fulfil the criteria.
- 2. Brace Stakes: is for two exhibits of the same or different sexes of the same breed belonging to the same person, each exhibit having been entered in some class other than brace or team
- **3.** Champion Stakes: is for a dogs who have gained the title of Champion under Irish Kennel Club rules or under another recognised Kennel Club Authority confirmed by date of closing of entries.

All exhibits entered in stakes classes must be entered in their relevant breed class. The Stakes Classes at this show are separate from breed judging and do not come under the rules of the Green Star System. An exhibit which has been beaten in a stakes class but wins Best of Breed may proceed to compete in its relevant group.

**Please note:** All dogs entered for this show must be registered or transferred at the Irish Kennel Club or other FCI Kennel club in the name of the exhibitor.

### **SHOW REGULATIONS**

- 1. The show will be held under the rules of the Irish Kennel Club Limited.
- 2. The show will be held at the. Clonmel and District Canine Club All Breed Championship Show on 18<sup>th</sup> August, 2024. Judging will not commence before 12.30 on the day of show.
- 3. No claim will be considered in the event of an exhibit being late for its class. No persons will be allowed into the judging ring except the Judge, Show Officials, or an exhibitor taking a dog in for adjudication. The exhibit number of each dog much be clearly displayed by its handler.
- 4. Entry Fees: First dog €25.00 / Stg£25.00. Each subsequent dog: €10.00 / Stg£10. Or 4 Dogs or more €50. Online entries will be taken until midnight on Tuesday 6<sup>th</sup> August, 2024 on www.dogsmowentry.ie
- 5. The Committee reserve the right to reject any entry, advert or other insertion in the Catalogue. The Committee reserve the right to alter the proposed order of judging if this should become necessary In the event of any appointed Judge failing to keep his/her appointment, the Committee reserve the right to appoint another Judge.
- 6. Ineligible Entries: a transfer of an incorrect entry as to the sex or breed is allowed if reported to the Secretary's Office prior to commencement of judging. A dog entered in a Class for which is it not eligible may be transferred to the Open Class in that breed, but in no other respects.
- 7. .Registrations: All dogs entered for competition at this Show must be registered at the IKC Ltd, Unit 36, Greenmount Office Park, Harold's Cross, Dublin 6.

- **8.** A Judge will be empowered to withhold any prizes of Green Stars if, in his/her opinion, the exhibits are not of sufficient merit.
- **9.** The Catalogue **will only be available online**.
- 10. Car Park paid to Clonmel and District Canine Club Championship Show.
- 11. The Catalogue will be compiled from the entry forms and while every effort will be made to have the forms correctly interpreted, the Committee cannot accept any responsibility or mistakes, which may bring exhibitors within the purview of the IKC Ltd, Rule 15, Section 1, or for clerical errors that may occur during compilation.
- **12.** The Promoting Body will not be responsible for any loss or damage sustained through accident by exhibits, exhibitors, or other persons attending the show.
- **13.** The Promoting Body shall be the Show Committee and all disputes shall be dealt with by the Show Committee. Parties to any dispute shall have the right to appeal to the IKC Ltd.
- **14.** Exhibitors must clean up after the dogs. Suitable facilities will be provided for this purpose.

Any Exhibitor found not cleaning up after their dog will be liable to a €50 fine.
