My father bought me my first Irish Red Setter in 1980 after many months of my searching through newspaper classified advertisements and begging to go look at puppies.

He had working setters and springers for many years beforehand, which he used for rough shooting, mainly on pheasant and snipe.

I showed my first dog for several years at open show level before obtaining Ir. Ch. Dunswood Thunderbird. He won my first Green Star (and the Gundog Group) at the IKC St. Patrick's Day Show in March 1988.

I went on to make him up as a show champion and later qualified him in the field to obtain his full title.

I have also campaigned Sh. Ch. Reddins Declan, who gained his title in 1994. He was runner up in the Irish Pup of the Year finals (all breeds), and the first Irish Setter puppy to qualify for the final. He also won a Challenge Certificate, BOB and Group 2 under UK Kennel Club rules.

I owned and showed Ir. and UK. Ch. Fearnley Firesheen at Ranaleen to her Irish and UK. show titles and then qualified her in the field to become the first such titleholder in over fifteen years.

I am a firm believer that our show gundogs should retain a minimum work ethic as is reflected in our breed standards. I am a member of several championship dog show committees and Treasurer of the Irish Red Setter Club's general and show committees.

I am a civil engineer by profession and judged for the first time under Irish Kennel Club rules in 1989. I first awarded Green Stars in 1991 (Irish Setters) and I am now qualified under FCI rules to award CACIB's in Groups 3, 7 & 8 (and judge the groups). I also judge some breeds in Group 6 and have judged BIS at Championship level.

As well as Ireland, I have judged in England, Scotland, Wales, Spain, The Netherlands, Germany, Poland, Belgium, Switzerland and Sweden.

I also award C.C.'s under UK Kennel Club rules and have had the pleasure of judging our lovely breed at this level on three occasions to date.

I consider it a great honour to be asked to judge at the Irish Red Setter Club Championship Show 2022 and thank the officers and committee for their kind invitation.

I look forward to meeting you all in the ring.

Ring Etiquette/Code of Conduct

We are very privileged to be the owners, breeders and exhibitors of the very wonderful Irish Setter. As such, we need to remember that we are only the caretakers of this beautiful, intelligent breed and we must do our utmost to make sure that it leaves our hands as a stronger, healthier breed than we found it.

- Dog Shows are a hobby and should be enjoyed by everyone, win or lose.
- Exhibitors commit themselves to values of fair play, honesty, courtesy and vigorous competition, as well as winning and losing with grace.
- We should all have respect for ourselves, our judge and our fellow exhibitors.
- Nastiness and sarcastic remarks have no place in or out of the show ring.
- Always leave the entrance to the ring clear of chairs, cages etc.
- Stay near your ring so that you will have your dog ready to go into his class when called.
- Pay attention to your dog. You only have a short time for your dog to impress the judge, use it wisely.
- If the judge asks the class to move around the ring together, check that the other exhibitors are ready before moving off.
- Always keep a reasonable distance between your dog and the one in front, whether standing or moving.
- Always stand your dog in line with the other exhibits.
- There is no rule against exhibiting a bitch in season. However, it is not recommended for the bitch's health, comfort and safety and is certainly not appreciated by other exhibitors.
- If your dog is placed in his class, always thank the Steward for your prize card or rosette and always congratulate the winner, be it in a class, a Group or Best in Show.
- Always remember that whether your dog wins or not, you will always take the best dog home.

CLASS DEFINITION

(The word "Dog" includes both sexes)

A BABY PUPPY CLASS is confined to dogs over 4 and under 6 months of age on the day of the show. Dogs entered in this class are not eligible to challenge for the Green Star and may not take part in any further competition except best Baby Puppy in show.

A PUPPY CLASS is confined to dogs over 6 and under 12 calendar months of age on the day of the show, computed from and inclusive of the date of its birth.

A JUNIOR CLASS is for dogs over 9 months and under 18 calendar months of age on the day of the show, computed from and inclusive of the day of its birth.

AN INTERMEDIATE CLASS is for dogs between 15 and 24 calendar months of age on the day of the show, computed from and inclusive of the day of its birth.

AN ADULT CLASS is for dogs between 24 and 36 calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

AN OPEN CLASS is for dogs over 15 calendar months of age on the day of the show, computed from and inclusive of the day of its birth.

A CHAMPION CLASS is for dogs who have gained the title of Champion under Irish Kennel Club rules or under a recognized kennel authority confirmed by the date of closing of entries.

VETERAN CLASS is for dogs over 8 years of age on the day of the show, computed from and inclusive of the day of its birth.

A FIELD TRIAL CLASS is confined to dogs that have won a least a reserve in a Novice, Puppy, Derby or Open Stake.

BRACE CLASS is for two exhibits of the same or different sexes of the same breed belonging to the same person, each exhibit having been entered in some class other than Brace or Team.

A TEAM CLASS is for three exhibits ore more, belonging to the same owner, each exhibit to have shown in at least one other class for the breed.

A SPECIAL PROGENY CLASS is for Stud Dogs and Brood Bitches who will be judged on their progeny appearing in the ring with them, each of the progeny to have been shown in at least one other class for the breed.

PLEASE NOTE: A veteran dog who is a Champion may enter in either Veteran or Champion class but not both. A dog or bitch may be entered in ONE CLASS only.

Special Beginners Stakes; A new stakes class to help promote newcomers to the scene and also to encourage some competing in the more numerically strong breeds. To be eligible to compete, neither the owner/handler or the dog will have won a Green Star prior to the entry closing date of the show. This class can be offered at any show. This is judged on the quality of the dog and placings are 1-4 as in the other stakes classes. The organising Show Society decide the prizes they wish to offer (and if they want to charge an entry fee. In the event that a dog is co-owned, all owners must fulfil the criteria). This class is optional for 2022 and will become mandatory from 01/01/2023

SHOW REGULATIONS

1. JURISDICTION: The Show will be held under the Rules of the Irish Kennel Club as in force at the date of publication of the Schedule.

2. All dogs entered for competition must be registered or transferred at the Irish Kennel Club Ltd.

3. VENUE: The Show will be held at the Leopardstown Racecourse, Co. Dublin, on Saturday 28th May 2022.

4. ENTRY FEES: First dog €20.00 , all subsequent entries €10.00 Postal entries will be received up to and including 9th May (POSTMARK).

On-line entries close 13th May, 2022.

5. REJECTION OF ENTRIES: etc. The Committee reserves the right to reject any entry, advertisement or other insertion in the Catalogue.

6. ENTRY FORMS: The Catalogue will be compiled from the entry forms submitted by exhibitors and while every endeavour will be made to have forms correctly interpreted, the promoting body cannot accept any responsibility for mistakes therein.

7. ENTRY FEES: Fees for exhibits failing to arrive or rejected by the Veterinary Surgeon will be forfeited.

7. JUDGES: In the event of the appointed judge failing to keep his or her engagement, the committee shall have the right to fill the vacancy thus caused.

8. JUDGING: Judging will commence at 11.00am. sharp and no claim will be considered in the event of an exhibit being late. No person will be allowed in the judging ring except the judge, show officials, or an exhibitor taking in a dog for adjudication. The exhibition number of each dog must be clearly displayed by the handler, who shall not wear a badge or other decoration in the judging ring. The club will not be responsible for any exhibit in the ring at the time of judging.

9. ACCIDENT OR DAMAGE: The club will not be responsible for any loss or damage sustained through accident by exhibits, exhibitors or other persons attending the show.

IKC rule: for insurance purposes, dogs not for exhibition but present on the show ground on the day of the show must be registered with the secretary before the show. Fee €5 per dog

Section 1 - Rule - Registration: Every dog exhibited or competing at any show, field trial or obedience test must be registered with the IKC Ltd. in the name of the exhibitor or competitor, save in case of greyhounds duly registered with the Irish Coursing Club and dogs not of a recognised breed for which licences have been approved for obedience or working test. Failure to comply with the above will result in (A) the dog being disqualified from the event and (B) the exhibitor being fined € 127.00 the implementation of which will be a normal office routine. All appeals to the Irish Kennel Club should carry a fee of €6.00 refundable if the appeal is upheld.
