# Our Judge Mr. Peter Pask



### Baronglen Irish Wolfhounds

Since a young boy I had always wanted an Irish Wolfhound and Pat and I, after we married, finally made the decision to look at owning one. Fortunately for us we were put in touch with Ruth and Leslie Jenkins of Eaglescrag fame and there the story begins.

Our first wolfhound was bought in 1976 and was Gwernyfed Llemenig (Sire Ch Eaglescrag Toby, Dam Carrokeel Annwn). He was the litter brother to the 1980 Irish Olympic Team Mascott Gwernyfed Lleigus of Carrokeel. We knew very little about the conformation and movement and Pat chose him because he rolled over and licked her leg and she thought "oh let's have him as he likes us." With the help of Ruth over the years we learnt about the breed.

We bought a bitch from Alan Hyett of Buckhurst fame, moved house and in 1979 had our first litter from Buckhurst Keran and Ch Eaglescrag Toby. We haven't had many litters but have bred or owned 10 UK Champions, our latest being Champion Baronglen the Noblemen JW ShEX (OSW)(AI). To date the Nobleman's greatest achievements are to win this year Reserve Best in Show at both the Irish Wolfhound Society and Irish Wolfhound Club

Championship shows and he is still not three years of age. His great, great grandfather Ch Baronglen the Jaywalker had already won Reserve Best in Show at the Club show in 2009, his great grandfather Champion Baronglen the Lawman SchCM won Best in Show at the Irish Wolfhound Club Championship show in 2014 and in April 2018 his grandfather Ch Amarach Aaron of Baronglen also won Reserve Best in Show and in 2019 the overall Reserve CC winner in show.

However, it must be said the joy for me has not been the wins or the number of Champions but the wonderful temperament and character of each of the dogs and the pleasure I have in owning them and living with them. I like nothing better than tramping about in the fields watching them running and hunting. The girls are quicker and often catch rabbits. You will see them going away with their quarry and woe betide anyone who approaches them

while they are devouring their prey. The boys however tend to sit down looking longingly.!!!!

I have been a stalwart supporter of the Irish Wolfhound Club since 1976 and it is very dear to my heart. I was Chairman for 10 years and a Vice President for many years..

I awarded my first set of Challenge Certificates in 1986 and always feel it is an honour and a great privilege when asked to judge Irish Wolfhounds. I have judged both in the UK including Crufts 2002 and many other countries around the world. I also award Challenge Certificates in Deerhounds.

When I am judging I look for what is in essence a long coated greyhound. I am always aware that an Irish Wolfhound was bred, not as a pack animal like the Deerhound, but to hunt alone. To do that he must have substance, balance and stamina.

Thank you so much for the invitation to judge your show and I look forward to meeting friends old and new.

#### **RULES & REGULATIONS**

- Jurisdiction: The show will be held under the license and rules of the Irish Kennel Club.
- Registration: All dogs entered for competition, or otherwise must be registered at the Irish Kennel Club Ltd as in force on 1<sup>st</sup> January 2024
   Rosettes will be given to 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup> and Reserve in each class. Cups and trophies
- 3. Rosettes will be given to 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup> and Reserve in each class. Cups and trophies will be presented to paid up members of the Irish Wolfhound Society of Ireland only and are offered under Society rules.
- 4. Exhibits: each Exhibitor should be responsible for keeping their exhibits under proper control at all times.
- Judge: Judging will commence at 11am sharp. In the event of the appointed judge failing to keep his/her engagement the committee shall have the right to appoint another judge.
- 6. Interpretation; All disputes shall be dealt with by the committee. Parties to such dispute have the right to appeal to the Irish Kennel Club.
- Accident or Damage: The Society shall not be responsible for any loss or damage sustained through accidents by exhibits, exhibitors or other persons attending the show.
- 8. Veterinary Examination: The Veterinary surgeon in attendance will have the power to exclude any exhibit which, in his opinion, is not fit for exhibition on account of disease, vice, lice or other causes.
- 9. Entries: The committee reserves the right to reject any entry.
  Entry fees: There will be an entry fee of €25 for the first dog, €5 for the second and €35 for three or more dogs in the same ownership. Stakes Classes €5 per dog
- Entries close on the 1<sup>st</sup> July 2024 (postmark). Entry forms must be completed in ink.

- 14. Children: Any child attending to exhibit or otherwise participate at the show remains the responsibility and in the care of their parent or guardian at all times.

# Irish Kennel Club Sportsmen

Sportsmen respect the history, traditions and integrity of the sport of purebred dogs.

The sportsman judge judges only on the merits of the dogs and considers no other factors.

The sportsman judge or exhibitor accepts constructive criticism.

The sportsman exhibitor declines to enter or exhibit under a judge where it might reasonably appear that the judge's placements could be based on something other than the merits of the dogs.

The sportsman exhibitor refuses to compromise the impartiality of a judge.

The sportsman respects the Irish Kennel Clubs bye-laws, rules, regulations and policies governing the sport of purebred dogs.

Sportsmen find that vigorous competition and civility are not inconsistent and are able to appreciate the merit of their competition and the effort of competitors.

Sportsmen welcome, encourage and support newcomers to the sport.

Sportsmen will deal fairly with all those who trade with them.

Sportsmen are willing to share honest and open appraisals of both the strengths and weaknesses of their breeding stock

Sportsmen spurn any opportunity to take personal advantage of positions offered or bestowed upon them.

Sportsmen always consider as paramount the welfare of their dog.

Sportsmen refuse to embarrass the sport, the Irish Kennel Club, or themselves while taking part in the sport

Note: The term sportsman and sportsmen in this context is gender neutral.

### **Class Definitions**

**Baby Puppy Class** is for dogs over the age of four months and under the age of six months on the day of the show computed from and inclusive of the day of its birth.

**Puppy Class** is for dogs over the age of six months and under the age of twelve months on the day of the show computed from and inclusive of the day of its birth.

**Junior Class** is for dogs between nine and eighteen months of age of six months on the day of the show computed from and inclusive of the day of its birth.

**Intermediate Class** is for dogs between the age of 15 and 24 months on the day of the show computed from and inclusive of the day of its birth.

**Adult Class** is for dogs between the age of 24 and 36 months on the day of the show computed from and inclusive of the day of its birth.

**Open Class** is for dogs over the age of 15 months of age on the day of the show computed from and inclusive of the day of it birth.

**Champion Class** is for dogs who have gained the title of Champion under Irish Kennel Club rules or under a recognised Kennel Authority confirmed by the closing date of entries

**Veteran Class** is for dogs over eight years of age on the day of the show computed from and inclusive of the day of its birth.

**Neutered Class** is for sterilised dogs over the age of four month. They may not compete in any other class other than Best Neuter in Show.

**Beginner Stakes Class** To be eligible for this class neither the owner, handler, or dog owner will have won a Green Star. In the event of co-owners all owners must fulfil the criteria. The class is judged on the quality of the dog.

N.B.: The word dog includes both sexes.

A dog or bitch may be entered in ONE BREED CLASS ONLY (no double entries)
